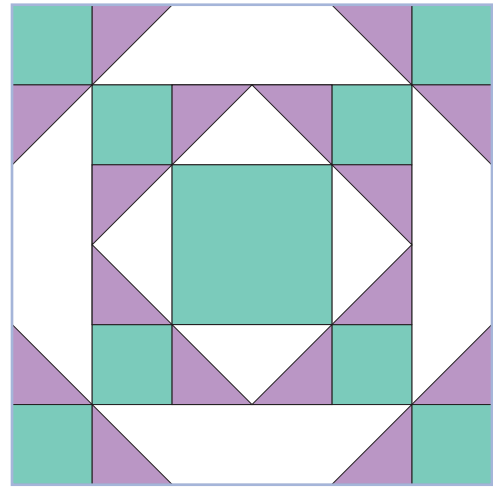
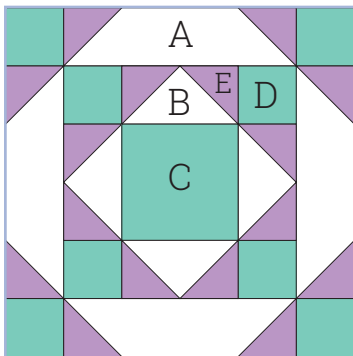

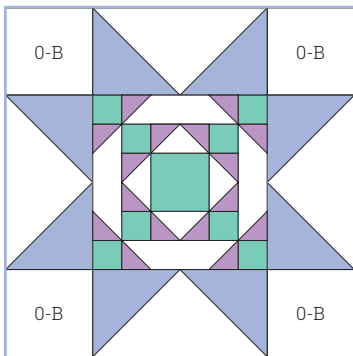

Background	A	(4) 1 ½" x 4 ½"
	B	(4) 1 ½" x 2 ½"
Fabric 11 	C	(1) 2 ½" x 2 ½"
	D	(8) 1 ½" x 1 ½"
Fabric 13 	E	(16) 1 ½" x 1 ½"



To finish the Sawtooth Block you will also need:

(4) Fabric 8 Flying Geese Units
(4) 0-B squares

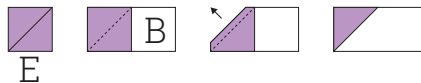

PATTERN NOTES AND ABBREVIATIONS

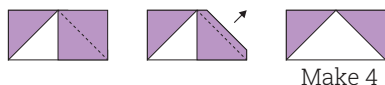
- Sew with a ¼" seam allowance throughout, unless noted.
- For best fabric nesting results, follow pressing arrows shown in the pattern, unless otherwise stated.
- Blocks or units may be assembled larger to allow for precise trimming throughout.
- The use of directional fabric may alter the yardage requirements.
- Abbreviations to note:
 - RST - Right Sides Together
 - HST - Half Square Triangle(s)
 - WOF - Width of Fabric, 42" - 44"
 - HWOFF - Half Width of Fabric, 21" - 22"
 - LOF - Length of Fabric
- Two center blocks will be released each month and will measure 6" x 6" finished.

ASSEMBLY

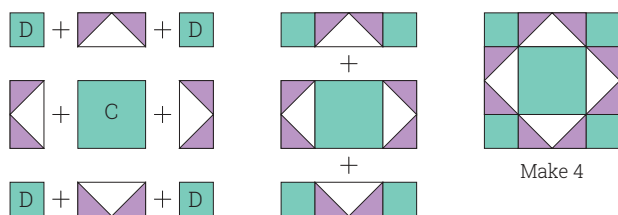
1. Draw a line diagonally on the wrong side the (8) Fabric E squares.
With RST, place a Fabric E square on the left side of (4) Fabric B rectangles as shown.
Sew on the drawn line.
Trim a $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from the sewn line.
Press according to the arrows.



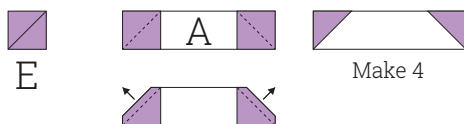
With RST, place a Fabric E square on the right side of the (4) units as shown.
Sew on the drawn line.
Trim a $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from the sewn line.
Press according to the arrows.
The units should measure $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $2\frac{1}{2}$ ".



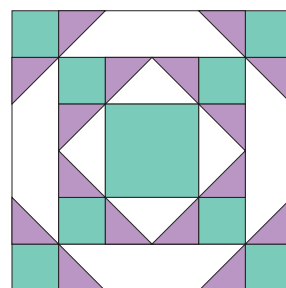
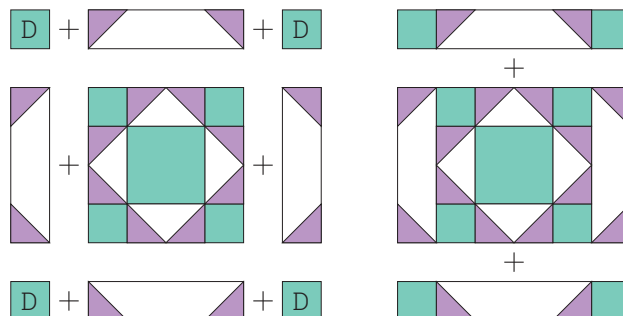
2. Using (1) Fabric C and (4) Fabric D squares, along with the units made in step one, sew together the center unit as shown.
Press as desired.
The unit should measure $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ ".



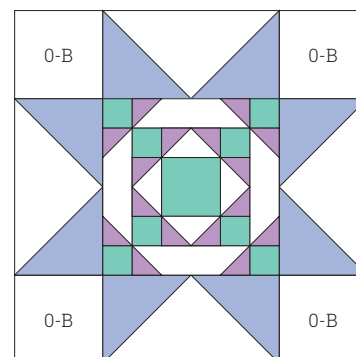
3. Draw a line diagonally on the wrong side of (8) Fabric E squares.
With RST, place a Fabric E square on the right and left sides of (4) Fabric A rectangles.
Sew on the drawn line.
Trim a $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from the sewn line.
Press according to the arrows.
The unit should measure $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ ".



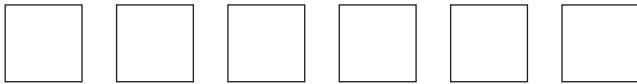
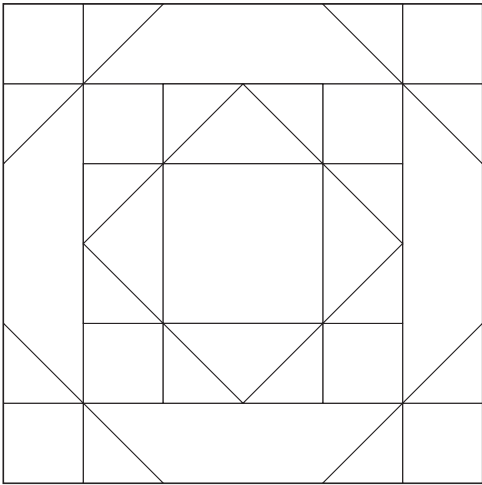
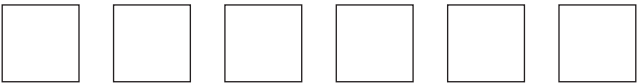
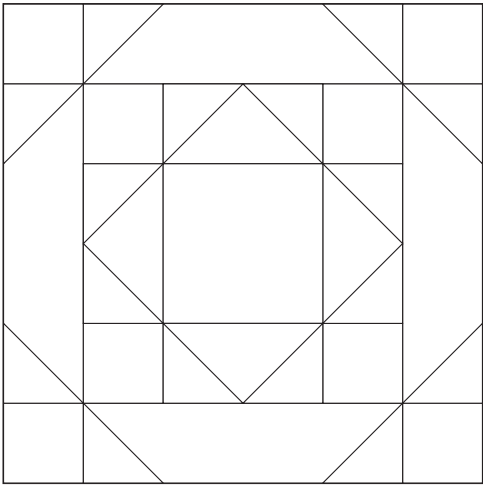
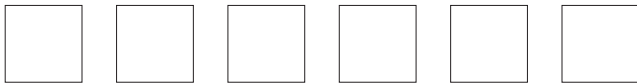
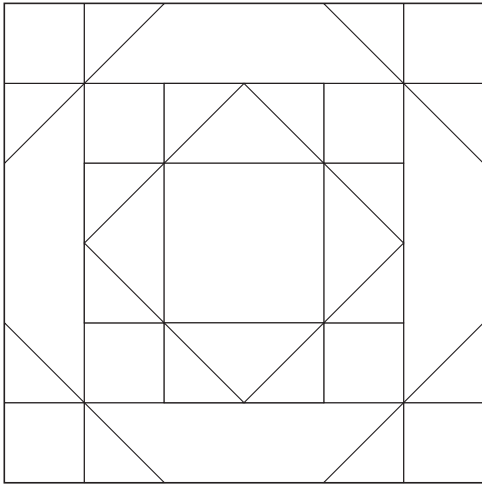
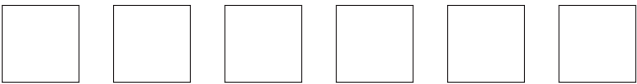
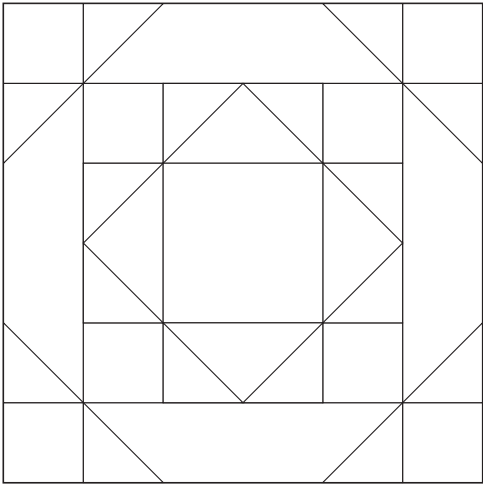
4. Using (4) Fabric D squares and the units made in steps two and three, assemble the block as shown.
Pay attention to the rotation of the units.
Press as desired.
The block should measure $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ ".



5. Use (4) Fabric 8 Flying Geese units and (4) 0-B squares to finish the block.
Press as desired.
The block should measure $12\frac{1}{2}$ " x $12\frac{1}{2}$ ".
